

Abortion Pill Complications

AND WHY AREN'T WE

Independent research shows that complications from the abortion drug mifepristone are far more common than reported by abortion advocates and the media.

- Industry claims serious complications occur in <0.5% of cases. The independent 2024 EPPC study of 865,000+ insurance claims found ~11% of women experienced serious adverse events.

Concealment of Complications:

- Women are told to report complications as miscarriages.
- Fear of exposure or prosecution discourages honest disclosure.
- Leads to systemic underreporting and misclassification in ER data.

Abortion Industry Spin:

- Reclassifies serious outcomes (failed abortions, hemorrhage, infection, surgical follow-up) as 'minor.'
- Studies exclude or minimize ER visits and follow-up surgeries. Inflated 'success rates' ignore patients lost to follow-up.

Media Neglect:

- Press repeats abortion industry talking points.
- FDA has documented 36 deaths and thousands of complications since 2000, but stories are minimized or reframed.
- Reporting requirements for non-death complications dropped in 2016.

The abortion pill mifepristone poses significant and underreported health risks. A system of concealment, media neglect, and industry manipulation has distorted the safety profile. Accurate reporting, government oversight, and independent media investigations are urgently needed.
